

Understanding Regulatory Requirements: Federal Requirements

- Accreditation Category I and II
- Animal inspection by veterinarian required
- Attest that animal(s) free of clinical signs of disease
- Testing in some circumstances
- CVI written for interstate movement - 9 CFR 86.5(c)
- CVI written within 10 days inspection -9 CFR 161.4
- Animal can travel for up to 30 days of animal inspection
- Submit copy of CVI to state of origin within 7 calendar days - 9 CFR 86.5(b)(1)



Understanding Regulatory Requirements: State Requirements

- Testing
- Vaccination
- Remarks and attestations
- Prohibitions



The Critical Role of CVIs in Animal Health

- Documentation of movement
 - Who was where when?
- Understanding disease exposure
- Controlling the movement of exposed animals
- Trade implications




Avoiding the Pitfalls: Common CVI Errors

- **Paper certificates**
 - Pre-signing CVIs
 - “Expired” inspection
 - Delay in submitting to state office
 - Not meeting state requirements
 - Missing tests
 - Missing remarks
- **All certificates**
 - Not inspecting the animals
 - Not providing necessary remarks



Advantages of Electronic Certificates

- Address book functionality
- Use of templates
- Address matching tools
- Rapid ID input
- Comply with documentation and records retention requirements
- Auto-transmit CVIs to state of origin per CFR
- Validation for interstate requirements
- Sharing of record with clients to reduce time burden on clinic staff
- “Can’t imagine going back to paper”

Important: Temporary Pause in Acceptance of EECVI Movement Permits for Equine

Due to a multi-state outbreak of Equine Herpes Virus (EHV) linked to multiple equine events, several states have paused the acceptance of EECVI movement permits for equine entry through December 19, resulting in a total 30-day suspension.

To assist in the management of this outbreak:

- If your client intends to move their equine between now and 12/19, please issue a CVI.
- Contact the destination [state's animal health officials](#) before any equine movement to confirm current entry requirements, as states may be implementing additional restrictions or alternative documentation requirements.

You may continue to issue EECVIs. Please note:

- Movement permit acceptance has been temporarily paused until 12/19.
- For clients planning movement after 12/19, an EECVI will remain valid for up to six months from the date of issuance.


GVL anticipates that EECVI permits will be accepted again in the near future and will provide updates as soon as the permits are accepted once again. Thank you for your cooperation in protecting equine health.

Note: December 19 is the anticipated date that these restrictions will be lifted, but this date may change depending on the nature of the EHV outbreak.


How to Create eHealth Certificates - 100
